This meeting was conducted via teleconference and the purpose of the meeting was to provide a status update on the past quarter's activities of the One Health Record® initiative.

Outreach:

- Bill Mixon has presented three presentations to conferences related to our work with One Health Record
- A new One Health Record® Web site was launched in May and is now available. The new web site advertises our services, policies, technology, benefits, and progress. The Commission was asked to review the web site and provide feedback. The web site address is :

- The University of South Alabama Regional Extension Center has been assisting One Health Record® by visiting clinical practices in East Alabama and asking for their participation in the pilot.

East Alabama Pilot progress:

- With the assistance of the Regional Extension Center, we have recruited four clinical practices to participate in the pilot. These practices have signed participation agreements with One Health Record and we are now working with each EHR vendor to begin the process of

onboarding. We are now working with their EHR vendors to recruit more clinical practices to participate in the pilot. The vendors are Greenway, MedConnect, AllScripts and CPSI.

- Using the remainder of the ONC grant funding, we purchased computer hardware and ETransX data mapping software. This new facility, coupled with the existing Truven system, will expedite the onboarding process and we are currently installing it in the data center in Montgomery.
- During the next couple of weeks, we hope to establish active connections with the pilot clinics in East Alabama and will report the progress to you during our next quarterly meeting.
- The pilot project schedule is included with these minutes.

Hospital onboarding:

- Three hospitals are actively connecting to One Health Record, and we hope to have the connections completed by the fall of 2014.
- We have obtained a proposal from Truven to develop the capability to receive public health reporting messages and will be adding this service to One Health Record® by fall 2014

Direct Connect Messaging:

- Our direct messaging service continues to grow, with 635 individual users in 29 facilities using it. Our web site is updated frequently to show the usage of One Health Record.

Federal Planning and funding

- We have submitted an updated Implementation Planning Document to CMS to obtain 90/10 federal funding for the rest of FY 14 and all of FY15. This planning document outlines our goals to connect Medicaid eligible providers and eligible hospitals to One Health Record by the end of FY16 to support the rollout of Medicaid's Regional Care Organization Plan. The document also has our budget and initial funding model for the pilot. If you would like a copy of the IAPD update, it will be posted on our web site in the near future after CMS review.

Next Steps:

- Develop a five year strategic plan for One Health Record®
- Develop a long term fair share funding model
- Complete the East Alabama Pilot by December 2014
- Begin adding staff to One Health Record® to ramp up participation from RCO hospitals and providers
